Rosenbach Museum & Library Welcomes Three New Trustees

PHILADELPHIA – The Rosenbach Museum & Library, a Philadelphia landmark noted for its exceptional collection of rare books, manuscripts, art, and 18th and 19th Century British and American furniture, announced the recent appointment of **Steven Raab**, **Pamela Tudor**, and **Clare Yellin** as members-at-large to the organization's Board of Trustees.

Steven Raab, an Ardmore resident and University of Pennsylvania and Temple Law School graduate, began practicing law in 1978, but changed professions when he turned his childhood love of collecting autographs and historical items into a business specializing in American historical manuscripts. By the late 1990s, this new venture, The Raab Collection, allowed him to close his law office and turn his passion for history into his full time job. He is a founding member and former Executive Vice President of the Professional Autograph Dealers Association (PADA) and is also a member of the Manuscript Society and Universal Autograph Collectors Club. Raab was named a Penn Ambassador for the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission after a nomination from Pennsylvania State Senator Connie Williams.

Pamela Tudor, a resident of Center City, is the Founder and President of Tudor Consulting, an executive coaching and organizational consulting firm with expertise in developing and facilitating leadership competency and diversity. She has worked with a wide range of industries, and her clients include: Citizens Bank, Sodhexo USA, AstraZeneca, Merck, Prudential, and Columbia University. She is a co-author of the *Right Management Study on Virtual Teams* and served on the boards of the Partnership for the Delaware Estuary and the Business Roundtable of the Philadelphia Chapter of the National Association of Women Business Owners. Tudor also spends her free time creating mixed-media art.

Clare Yellin, of Bryn Mawr, is President of a business founded in 1909 by her grandfather, famed ironworker Samuel Yellin. The business, now known as Samuel Yellin Metalworkers, produces replicas of her grandfather's work—using his tools and techniques—as well as new work. She also lectures and publishes on metalworking and advises private collectors and museums. She has been involved with the Rosenbach since 2000, when she was retained to restore the museum's Yellin gates. That project led to the long-term loan of a selection of ironwork from her private collection. Yellin is a graduate of Denison University.
